

WEDNESDAY NIGHT LENTEN STUDY

The Lenten Study on Wednesday nights after WEAC is titled, Jesus in the Wild. In the Spring, there will again be Bible Study for those who wish to participate. The Bible Study will start at 6:30 p.m., and it will be geared to the 40 Days of the Lenten Season. Author Dan Wilt wrote a wonderful piece within the remarkable scene in Luke 4:1–14 of Jesus being challenged by the devil in the "wild"—the untamed and unruly wilderness? And what are the surprising implications of this event for followers of Jesus today? In *Jesus in the Wild* you'll take a forty day journey into the heart of one of the most unusual, and often most misunderstood, stories in the Gospel accounts. In this encounter, following his baptism in the Jordan and before the inauguration of his ministry, Jesus is alone with the adversary—the one whose works he had come to destroy (1 John 3:8). He faces three tests, or "temptations"—all aimed at unseating him from his identity, his belovedness, and his purpose as the Son of God.

Understanding how Jesus faced down the accuser in the wild, you and I will be equipped to address every demonic challenge that comes our way in the wild places in our own lives. Jesus in the Wild is a perfect personal study and daily reader for individuals who want to gain a deeper sense of their vocation and calling in Christ, and for groups or congregations wanting a study on this momentous event in Jesus' life.

Blessings today Members and Friends of First Methodist Church! Well, how did you do last week with the Mission Statement Challenge? If you didn't

get, let's learn it together. The statement is: To be Passionate Ambassadors of God's Extravagant love by Boldly Sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with Everyone.

At the time of our Newsletter writing, we are nine days away from the beginning of the Lenten Season 2024. The forty days of Lent will begin on Wednesday, February 14th with the Ash Wednesday Service, and continue through Saturday, March 30, 2024. The forty (40) days of the Lenten Season are counted starting on Ash Wednesday as day #1, and day #40 as Saturday, March 30, 2024. Do not count the Sundays, as each Sunday is considered a "mini-Easter" already.

As we enter the Lenten/Easter Season on February 14, 2024, the Lenten/Easter Theme for us will be The Heart Matters.... The point is that it takes an investment of your heart, my heart, our hearts...to open the door from the inside out in letting God into lives. And there is every conceivable condition of the heart in between these polar opposites.

It is my hope and prayer that each of us will find the courage to open our Hearts to God, and to His calling for our lives, in the Lenten Season. Let's allow ourselves as Christ Followers and the Church, to join in a time of spiritual reflection and intentional efforts in growing closer to God personally, and corporately as the church.

As we journey the Lenten Season, I am encouraging each of us to ponder deeply our heart matters. What is something our hearts have been holding on to; harboring; causing us distress over; causing others distress on; keeping us captive from living life; having us shut down from the joys of life? The season will be a great time to open the door of our hearts to God...

How are you coming along as a growing disciple of Jesus? Be a strong spiritual disciple by Celebrating His Holy Name in Worship; Cultivating our relationship with Jesus through Study; Contributing to the work of making disciples by our time/talents/gifts /skills/abilities; and Connecting not only to each other in the Body of Christ, but leading those who don't know God's love into His presence.
