WEDNESDAY NIGHT LENTEN STUDY

The Lenten Study on Wednesday nights after WEAC is titled, Jesus in the Wild. In the Spring, there will again be Bible Study for those who wish to participate. The Bible Study will start at 6:30 p.m., and it will be geared to the 40 Days of the Lenten Season. Author Dan Wilt wrote a wonderful piece within the remarkable scene in Luke 4:1–14 of Jesus being challenged by the devil in the "wild"—the untamed and unruly wilderness? And what are the surprising implications of this event for followers of Jesus today? In Jesus in the Wild you'll take a forty day journey into the heart of one of the most unusual, and often most misunderstood, stories in the Gospel accounts. In this encounter, following his baptism in the Jordan and before the inauguration of his ministry, Jesus is alone with the adversary—the one whose works he had come to destroy (1 John 3:8). He faces three tests, or "temptations"—all aimed at unseating him from his identity, his belovedness, and his purpose as the Son of God.

Understanding how Jesus faced down the accuser in the wild, you and I will be equipped to address every demonic challenge that comes our way in the wild places in our own lives. *Jesus in the Wild* is a perfect personal study and daily reader for individuals who want to gain a deeper sense of their vocation and calling in Christ, and for groups or congregations wanting a study on this momentous event in Jesus' life.

March 10th – James 2:1-9 Partiality is Lukewarm, Making Wrongs Right

March 17th 1 Peter 1:3-9 Living that I Don't have to overcome Sin

March 24th – Luke 19:28-44 Letting Go, and Letting God

March 31st Sunrise Service led by Youth Group 6:30 a.m.

March 31st Luke 24:1-8 It Matters What Your Heart Believes...

I pray that each of us will be Spiritually challenged during the next forty days of the Lenten Season to open the door of our hearts from the inside out, letting God into lives. That goes for the church as well. A reminder...our hearts can become a very protected area for us. When this happens, it's usually because we been vulnerable, we have risked getting hurt, and unfortunately, we have had a bad experience. Thus, we tell ourselves we won't let that happen again. Before we know it, we have walled off everything, yes, even God. In fact, we might have even allowed a little anger, distrust, hurt, doubt or even rejection to seep into our relationship with God.

It is my hope and prayer that each of us will find the courage to open our hearts to God, and to His calling for our lives, in the Lenten Season. I am hopeful that you will join me in seeking to allow ourselves as Christ Followers and the Church, to give our life a chance for spiritual renewal.

What is something our hearts have been holding on to; harboring; causing us distress over; causing others distress on; keeping us captive from living life; having us shut down from the joys of life? The season will be a great time to open the door of our hearts to God...
